Re: Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Clarification for Persons Supported in Isolation

Action: Read and post at site.

This memo will focus on PPE specific to providing care to supported persons who are in self-isolation for any reason or have been confirmed to have COVID-19.

If there are no reports of an acute respiratory illness or COVID-19 case or close contact exposure with COVID-19, then PPE for droplet and contact precaution is <u>NOT REQUIRED</u>.

From the available studies, COVID-19 is a virus that is transmitted through droplets or contact meaning little pieces of liquid that comes out of people's noses and mouths if they cough, sneeze or talk.

The proper PPE for droplet and contact precautions are:

- Gown
- Medical mask
- Protective eyewear (goggles or face shield)
- Gloves



Medical Mask

<u>COVID-19</u> is not an airborne virus. We do not need to use N95 respirators when caring for people with COVID-19.

Exception - CPR is considered an aerosol generating activity where N95 is an appropriate use. N95 are not required for droplet precautions outside of aerosol generating procedures.

Please use the *Self-Isolation and COVID-19 PPE Chart* for rational and appropriate use of PPE at Kerry's Place when persons supported are self-isolating or have COVID-19.

Help reduce waste of our PPE inventory by:

- Minimizing the need for PPE whenever possible
- Only using the PPE that is required for the task
- Encouraging the rational and appropriate use of PPE with your team

We must work together to ensure we have enough inventory when it is needed.
