Provincial Antigen Screening Program (PASP)

- Covered organizations under the Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH) Letter of Instruction for MCCSS on vaccination policy are eligible to receive antigen tests at no cost through the **Provincial Antigen Screening Program**.
- MCCSS recently streamlined and automated the onboarding and ordering processes for MCCSS organizations.
- New applicants are invited to apply through the <u>Ontario Together Portal</u>.
 - To expedite registration and access to tests when applying through the portal, please provide your Transfer Payment Recipient ID (TPR#) or CYFSA licensee number.
- Once approved, you will receive an approval confirmation email that contains a link to the <u>OACAS Ordering Portal</u>, where you can immediately place your first order for tests.

Recent updates to PASP guidance

The Ministry of Health continues to update <u>COVID-19 Guidance</u>: <u>Considerations for Antigen</u> <u>Point-of-Care Testing</u>, to reflect advice on the use of rapid antigen screening tests, as well as to facilitate rapid antigen point of care testing as a result of vaccine policy mandates.

Key updates in the most recent guidance include:

- Antigen POCT is not recommended for individuals who are fully vaccinated.
- Confirmatory testing is still required for a positive antigen POCT, and now can be done using a rapid molecular test (e.g., ID NOW) when rapid molecular tests can be reported into the Ontario Laboratories Information System (OLIS) as well as using laboratory- based PCR testing.
- Self-screening at home has been enabled through two changes to guidance:
 - Voluntary, unsupervised self-swabbing has been enabled.
 - Waste generated from at-home rapid antigen screening is exempt from guidance for disposal of test kits for organizations performing on-site workplace antigen screening programs.
