The Trap: human trafficking digital education tool

- The human trafficking education tool, The Trap simulates being targeted and recruited by a sex trafficker. It is intended to raise awareness about sex trafficking among youth in middle and high school teaching them what the dangers are, how to avoid them and where to get help.
- The Trap is designed to be used as part of a facilitated discussion led by an adult. **Facilitators must register with an email address**.

As Safe as Possible (ASAP) Learning Module on the Real Xchange

 The ASAP project focuses on educating people with an intellectual disability how to recognize and avoid victimization from crimes of human trafficking and exploitation.

Online Training Initiative to Address Human Trafficking

• This service is funded by the Ontario government and offers free online training, resources, tips, and tools to assist service providers working with survivors of human trafficking.

The SHIFT Training

 The SHIFT is a free online training tool that intends to increase the knowledge and practice of harm reduction within the developmental services sector. It aims to make differences in the lives of individuals with intersecting vulnerabilities and oppressions.



The Kenora Association for Community Living (KACL)

 KACL is a group that helps support adults and children with a disability to be included in all aspects of the community. They have worked alongside other community partners to help protect and provide services to survivors of human trafficking with a disability.

Montage Support Services

 Montage provides support services to individuals with a disability to provide them with quality care and support. They offer person-direction planning and work collaboratively with individuals to ensure that they receive quality services.
