Everyone in the world is unique. We all look different, and that makes us interesting.

Kindness for Everyone



Sometimes people are mean to others because they look different. This is called racism, and it hurts people's feelings very much.

Kindness for Everyone



Have you ever been bullied or left out? It feels bad inside, like your heart is hurting.

Kindness for Everyone



When someone experiences racism, they feel the same hurt you felt when you were bullied. The pain inside is the same.

Kindness for Everyone



We can choose to be kind. We can be a friend to everyone, no matter how they look or where they come from.



When we see someone being treated unfairly, we can stand up for them. Together, we are stronger.

Respect for All means a Better World. Every person deserves kindness and respect. When we treat everyone fairly, the world becomes a better place for all of us.

Continuing the Learning

We encourage you to read this often. It doesn't need to be brought up after an incident has occurred, but you can talk about it openly and keep the conversation open and going.

Questions you can ask at any time to keep the conversation going:

- What are some ways we can show respect to others?
- What differences can you spot in the photos in the book? What makes people different? What makes them the same?
- What can we do to make sure everyone feels safe?
- What if we say something we didn't know was racist? How can we make things right?
